Currently, Sarah is serving on the Board of Trustees for Chapman University where she and her husband Dan established the Dan and Sarah Hogan Special Collections Seminar Room at Leatherby Library. She serves on the World Literature Today Board of Visitors, the Board of Visitors for the Fred Jones, Jr. Museum of Art, and as Co-Chairman for Arts! Arts! Arts! benefiting the College of Fine Arts at the University of Oklahoma.

Sarah has been honored in the past with the Oklahoma City University Society's Dulaney-Browne Library Award, the Oklahoma City Public Schools Foundation's Wall of Fame Humanitarian Award, the Junior League of Oklahoma City's Sustainer of the Year Award, the Redlands Council of Girl Scouts Woman of the Year in Education and the Governor's Arts Award for Community Service.
