

## Common FAQs

### Can I apply for an absentee ballot online?

Yes. If you are registered to vote simply follow the instructions at <https://okvoterportal.okelections.us/>.

### Where can I get an absentee ballot application to mail in?

Absentee ballot applications are available at LWVOKC voter registration events, the OK State Election Board, your county election board, or you can print them online at [https://www.ok.gov/elections/Voter\\_Info/Absentee\\_Voting/](https://www.ok.gov/elections/Voter_Info/Absentee_Voting/)

### Do I need to request an absentee ballot for every election?

You can request an absentee ballot for:

- one election,
- multiple elections for the remainder of the calendar year, or
- all elections for the remainder of the calendar year.

### Will my absentee ballot require postage?

Yes. Your mailing may contain multiple pages and you should ensure there is sufficient postage attached based on the total weight of the mailing. Multiple stamps may be needed.

## \_\_\_ Register to vote

Not registered? Visit a LWVOKC voter registration drive or go to <https://okvoterportal.okelections.us/Home/RegWizard> for more information on how to register. **October 9, 2020 is the last day to register for the November 3, 2020 election.**

## \_\_\_ Request your absentee ballot

**October 27, 2020 at 5:00 pm is the deadline to request an absentee ballot for the November 3, 2020 election.**

## \_\_\_ Confirm the absentee ballot(s) you received is correct

Log in to <https://okvoterportal.okelections.us/> to view what ballot(s) you should have received. If you did not receive all your ballots, or received an incorrect ballot, contact your county election board.

## \_\_\_ Fill out your absentee ballot(s) the same as if you were voting in person

Use blue or black ink

Place in envelope marked BALLOT

## \_\_\_ Place your ballot(s) in the envelope with the affidavit and notary forms printed on the front and seal the envelope

## \_\_\_ Take your sealed envelope to the notary public, fill out and sign the affidavit front of the notary, have the notary fill out the notary portion, sign, and stamp their seal.

Note: Instead of notarization for the November 3, 2020 election only you may attach a copy of your voter ID card, driver's license, US Passport, Military ID, or Tribal ID to the front of the affidavit envelope using tape, paper clip, or staple.

## \_\_\_ Place the completed affidavit and notary envelope in the outer envelope addressed to your county election board.

## \_\_\_ Mail or deliver your completed ballot

Mailing: Weigh your envelope to confirm that you have attached sufficient postage. Postage rates can be found at <https://postcalc.usps.com/>. **Ballots must be received by the county election board no later than 7:00 pm on election day.** Plan to mail your ballot early to account for any postal delays.

Delivery: If you have a standard ballot (you have not requested a special incapacity, military, or other ballot) you may deliver your ballot to your county election board. **Ballots must be delivered by the voter, ID is required, and must be delivered no later than closing time the day before the election.**

## \_\_\_ Go to <https://okvoterportal.okelections.us/> to confirm your ballot has been received and counted

If it has not been, go to your polling place on election day and tell them you need to cast a provisional ballot.

\*If you are physically incapacitated (or care for someone who is physically incapacitated), in a nursing home, or in the military, call your county election board or visit [https://www.ok.gov/elections/Voter\\_Info/Absentee\\_Voting/index.html](https://www.ok.gov/elections/Voter_Info/Absentee_Voting/index.html) for special instructions.
