

Nicholas holds an undergraduate degree with highest honours in operations research and financial engineering with minors in computer science, statistics and machine learning, and applied and computational mathematics from Princeton University. He was the Valedictorian of Princeton's Class of 2020 and is the first Black Valedictorian in the University's 274 year

history.
